Accommodation:

- 6 nights in **homestay accommodation** in twin rooms in **full board** with breakfast, packed lunch and dinner (up to 4 students per family). Group Leaders in single rooms. Students will be accommodated together, in twin rooms (triple on request), in carefully selected host families in and around Bournemouth. **Bus pass provided for the duration of the stay.** Additional bus passes purchased at an additional cost. Half Day Trips

 Duration: 5 hours (*inc. 45-60 min driving to the destination and back*)

Destinations	Description
Jurassic Coast Durdle Door	Designated a UNESCO World Heritage site and voted one of the Greatest Natural Wonders in Britain in 2005, this crumbling, fossil-rich coastline was created over 100 million years ago when massive earth movements pushed up and tilted ancient layers of rock, opening it up to erosion and thus exposing a glorious neopolitan-like trio of rock from the Triassic, Jurassic and Cretaceous periods. Durdle Door is one of the Jurassic Coast's most iconic landscapes. It is a natural arch, formed from a layer of hard limestone standing almost vertically out of the sea. After a walk surrounded by these beautiful landscapes and cliffs, you will discover the very singular Durdle Door. The students will be allowed some free time to have a walk on their own. We will then head to the very typical British village of Lulworth.
Winchester	Calm, collegiate Winchester is a mellow must-see. The past still echoes strongly around the flint-flecked walls of this ancient cathedral city. It was the capital of Saxon kings and a power base of bishops, and its statues and sights evoke two of England's mightiest myth makers: Alfred the Great and King Arthur (he of the round table). Winchester's architecture is exquisite, from the handsome Elizabethan and Regency buildings in the narrow streets to the wondrous cathedral at its core, while its river valley location means there are charming waterside trails to explore. We will discover all the historical buildings together during your guided tour. Between the cathedral, the medieval walls, the great hall, Wolvesey Castle, the history of Alfred the Great, King Arthur or Jane Austen, you will be charmed by the city of Winchester
Salisbury (incl. Cathedral visit)	Salisbury Cathedral and its surrounding Close attract some 500,000 visitors each year. Many come as tourists, to worship or to attend concerts, workshops and art installations. There is nearly 800 years of history to explore, including Britain's tallest spire, the best preserved of only four surviving 1215 Magna Carta documents and the world's oldest working mechanical clock.
Portsmouth	Portsmouth is a port city and naval base on England's south coast, mostly spread across Portsea Island. It's known for its maritime heritage and Portsmouth Historic Dockyard. The dockyard is home to the interactive National Museum of the Royal Navy, the wooden warship HMS Victory, where Nelson died in the Battle of Trafalgar, and HMS Warrior 1860. The Tudor ship Mary Rose is also conserved in a dockyard museum.
Stonehenge	Walk in the footsteps of your Neolithic ancestors at Stonehenge – one of the wonders of the world and the best-known prehistoric monument in Europe. Explore the ancient landscape on foot and step inside the Neolithic Houses to discover the tools and objects of everyday Neolithic life. Visit the world-class exhibition and visitor centre with 250 ancient objects and come face to face with a 5,500 years-old man.
Swanage or Old Harry Rocks* <small>*Optionally, by public transport (groups up to 22 pax) + 45 min walking distance from the bus stop to Old Harry Rocks</small>	Old Harry Rocks are a pair of chalk-made rocks close to Handfast Point about 2 miles north east of Swanage. Old Harry lies at the eastern edge of the Isle of Purbeck and is the start of the Jurassic Coast World Heritage Site. Together with Old Harry Rocks, Swanage is situated on the Isle of Purbeck in Dorset, Swanage is an ideal gateway town, perfect for enthusiasts of long walks who likes to contemplate the beautiful nature and landscapes.
Christchurch* <small>*by public transport, approx. 30 min</small>	The town originates from approximately 350 AD and the 'Church' was founded by missionaries sent to Wessex by St Birinus, the first Bishop of Dorchester on Thames and its close proximity to the Cherbourg Peninsula in France made it an important trading port and a potential target for invasion during a number of wars. Situated on a stretch of raised, and well drained, land at the lowest crossing points of the river Avon and the river Stour, it was originally known as 'Twytenham' from Old English meaning 'between rivers'. After visiting the priory and hearing about the legend of the miraculous beam, you will understand why the church became Christ's Church of Twynham and then the city renamed to Christchurch.

London	Our Westminster walking tour will take you past London's most important seats of Royal and Political power in the United Kingdom. You will see many of London's most iconic attractions such as the House of Parliament, Big Ben, Westminster Abbey and Buckingham Palace. Enjoy shopping in top stores or have a nice lunch in one of the restaurants or cafes situated near famous Piccadilly Circus.
Bath	<i>*Optionally, incl. Roman Baths and/or Royal Crescent visit</i> Built for pleasure and relaxation, beautiful Bath has been a wellbeing destination since Roman times. The waters are still a big draw, both at the ancient Roman Baths and the thoroughly modern Thermae Bath Spa, which houses the only natural thermal hot springs in Britain you can bathe in. Immerse yourself in Bath's remarkable collection of museums and galleries, and enjoy year-round festivals, theatre, music and sports. Bath's stunning honey-coloured Georgian architecture is straight from a Jane Austen novel - highlights include the iconic Royal Crescent and the majestic Circus
Brighton	Discover Brighton attractions such as the Brighton Palace Pier, the Royal Pavilion built especially for King George or visit the brand-new British Airways i360. On top of that, the city is also home to a cornucopia of cultural delights as well as big name shops and hundreds of independent boutiques. There are many award-winning restaurants in Brighton & Hove catering for all tastes from classic fish 'n' chips to creative vegetarian restaurants and even, one of very few in UK, zero-waste restaurant.
Oxford	<i>*Optionally, incl. Christ Church College visit</i> Oxford is a university city situated about 60 miles from London, making a Oxford day trip an ideal way to get out of the bustling capital for a day or weekend to explore this compact historical city. Nicknamed the City of Dreaming Spires, Oxford is best known as the home of England's oldest university, the University of Oxford, which is still one of the most respected in the country. A trip to Oxford wouldn't be complete without touring a couple of university buildings, but Oxford has much else to offer.
Warner Bros Studio	If you are a Harry Potter fan – this trip is an absolute must-see. Warner Bros. Studio Tour London provides an amazing new opportunity to explore the magic of the Harry Potter films – the most successful film series of all time. This unique walking tour takes you behind-the-scenes and showcases a huge array of beautiful sets, costumes and props. It also reveals some closely guarded secrets, including facts about the special effects and animatronics that made these films so hugely popular all over the world.
Windsor Castle	Windsor Castle is a royal residence at Windsor in the English county of Berkshire. It is notable for its long association with the English and later British royal family and for its architecture. The original castle was built in the 11th century after the Norman invasion of England by William the Conqueror. Since the time of Henry I, it has been used by the reigning monarch and is the longest-occupied palace in Europe. The castle's lavish early 19th-century State Apartments were described as "a superb and unrivalled sequence of rooms widely regarded as the finest and most complete expression of later Georgian taste".
Stratford-Upon-Avon	Immerse yourself in the British literature history! Birthplace of Shakespeare, you will be charmed by this medieval market town packed with more than 800 years of history and heritage. We will walk on Shakespeare footsteps, discover the house where he was born and spent his childhood, the Swan theatre, the Royal Shakespeare theatre, the Holy Trinity Church where he was baptised and buried, and of course, have a stroll along the stunning river Avon, in the riverside garden.

Section 6: Cancellation Policy & Payment Schedule

Payment schedule:
