Entry into England

All visitors will be required to have a passport, ID card are not accepted anymore!

Recent changes to immigration rules and visas

From Wednesday 2 April 2025, everyone, including nationals from European countries (EU/ EEA and European micro-states), will need an **ETA** when entering the UK.

An **Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA)** is a digital permission to travel to the UK for those who do not currently need a visa to travel or have UK immigration status.

The ETA costs £16 per applicant and is valid for two years. The ETA is linked to the visitor's passport. A new ETA will be needed if the passport expires in less than two years.

Applications can be made online or via the UK ETA app, with decisions provided within three days. Submissions open on Wednesday, 5th March 2025.

Note: Make sure that you have all identification documents ready, as you might have to identify yourself at the passport control promptly.

Independent Arrival

You can choose a Self-Arranged Journey from the airport in the UK to our centre. This requires you to be accompanied by your parent/s or a guardian from the airport to our camp. Please, let us know your exact time of arrival in Exeter at least one week before your trip starts, so that we know when to expect you.

Generally, you should arrive in Exeter between 2 pm and 6 pm. Please contact our team 1 hour before your arrival via the mobile number provided at the end of these documents.

Our supervisors will then give you directions to the meeting point. Please make your way to: **Cornwall House, University of Exeter, St German's Rd, Exeter EX4 6TG, United Kingdom**

Although we don't advise it, if you are aged 16 plus you are permitted to make your own way to the centre without an accompanying adult if your parent or guardian has specifically requested this. Please follow the same instructions as above. Please note that in these cases the Company is not responsible for the students' welfare until they have arrived at the centre.

Low Budget Transfer

If you booked the low budget transfer from London Heathrow, please keep in mind that you must arrive before 4.00 pm at the airport.

On the day of your arrival a member of our IP staff will be waiting for you behind customs at the exit of the baggage reclaim area of your arrival terminal between 10 am and 5 pm. You will recognise our staff by their dark blue IP shirt/sweater and the IP sign.

PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE THE TERMINAL ON YOUR OWN!

In case you cannot find our member of staff please go to the information desk in your arrival hall and wait until our member of staff picks you up. Having this in mind, **please make sure you switch on your mobile phone after the plane lands**, so that you can be contacted on the number you have provided us with. If necessary, please call the Airport Coordinator **+44 (0) 776 2484 390**. In case you can't get hold of the Airport Coordinator, please call our emergency number.

Our staff member will then accompany you to the transfer service. Our coach shuttle will depart from Heathrow or a nearby pick up Service station at approximately 6 pm / 7 pm. In addition, it is advisable to carry money in pounds to buy something to eat or drink while you are waiting at the airport.

Individual Transfer

Alternatively, we can also arrange individual transfers for you. Transfers will be done by our well-known taxi and transfer companies with DBS checked drivers. In this case, you will be picked up at the exit of the baggage reclaim area of your arrival terminal by a member of staff of our partner company. You will recognise them by our **IP sign or a sign with your name on it**.

PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE THE TERMINAL ON YOUR OWN!

In case you cannot find the member of staff, go to the information desk of your arrival hall and call our emergency mobile number provided in this document and wait until you get picked up. With this in mind, **please make sure you switch on your mobile phone after the plane lands**, so that you can be contacted on the number you have provided us with.

You will then be taken directly to your course centre.

On the day of departure, you will leave the centre as required in order to make sure you arrive at the airport in time to check in. For students' safety, we accompany them to the check-in desk for their flight.

We ask you to leave your room and check out in the morning. Please arrange your plans for the departure day with our IP team in your course centre.

If you have booked a transfer with us, the team will give you all the necessary information.

Luggage and Immigration Regulations

One piece of check-in luggage is allowed per passenger. Usually, 20kg but please check with your airline directly about the individual allowance. Additionally, you can bring one piece of hand luggage, e.g., a backpack or a handbag (depending on the airline 7-10kg). To follow you will find a list of things which could be useful when preparing your suitcase:

- ✓ Trousers, T-shirts, pullovers, etc.
- ✓ Rain jacket/ small umbrella
- ✓ Comfortable walking shoes /closed shoes
- ✓ Swimsuit and beach towel
- ✓ **Towels**
- ✓ Sun cream / hat
- ✓ Toiletries bag with items for your personal hygiene

Things that must be in your hand luggage:

- ✓ your passport
- ✓ your visa
- ✓ Printed Parental consent form signed
- ✓ your health insurance card
- ✓ all important telephone numbers
- ✓ important medication (if needed)
- ✓ The below emergency contact card

Please remember that you will need an adaptor in England for the power plugs.

Please print and keep safely in your wallet or phone case the below card with the school details and emergency phone number:



Bedlinen in your accommodation is provided and will be changed once a week. Please remember to bring towels. The rooms and the bathrooms are cleaned regularly; but please keep your room in a proper state. A safe is not available in the centre, but you will get a key to lock your room.

Mobile app-operated laundry (can only be topped-up by a credit/debit card) is available in the residence at your own expense.

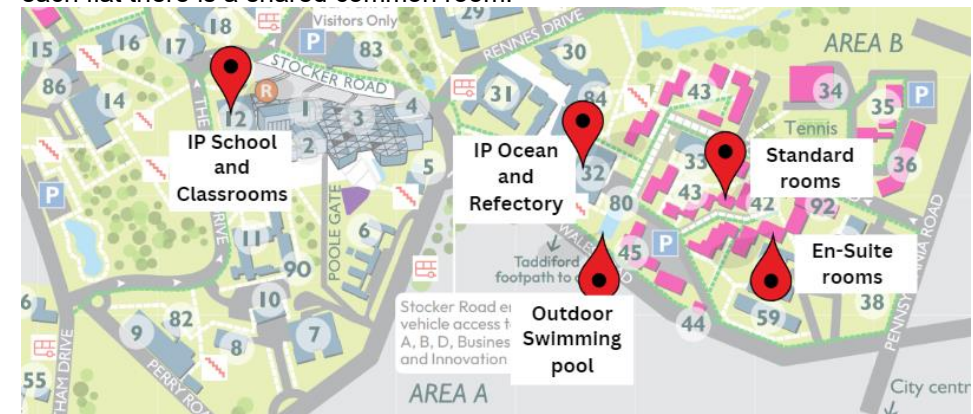
You will get full board accommodation that includes breakfast, warm lunch, and dinner. All meals are taken in the campus self-service refectory. After your meal, we kindly ask you to clear away the dishes and to clean the table.

Accommodation in the residence – Standard rooms

The residence offers single study-bedrooms. Each bedroom has a desk with chair, wardrobe, and a bed. Ratio Bathroom students: approx. 11 rooms share 3 toilets and 4 showers.

Accommodation in the residence – En-Suite rooms

In the en-suite blocks there are self-contained flats of 8 single bedrooms. Each room offers a desk, a wardrobe, a bed as well as a private shower and toilet. In each flat there is a shared common room.



Dietary Requirements

If you have booked any special dietary requirements with us, please inform our members of staff on arrival so the kitchen can provide alternatives. It is usual in England to offer tap water during mealtimes.

Outside mealtimes you can help yourself to water and fruit which are available to you in our IP Ocean Lounge.

University of Exeter: Streatham Campus

Situated in the North of the city, just a 20-minute walk from the town centre, the Streatham Campus of Exeter University is an attractive university campus overlooking the historic city of Exeter. The beautiful campus grounds contain 350 acres of woodland, lakes and parks. The residential houses, the refectory and the classrooms for your English lessons are all situated on campus. On the Streatham Campus we have our accommodation blocks in the student residence “Cornwall House” where you’ll also find our IP Ocean and the refectory.

There are outdoor sport facilities and a heated outdoor swimming pool (to be used once a week) on campus. Public payphones and a launderette with mobile app-operated washing and drying machines (**can only be topped-up by a credit/debit card**) help to ensure that your stay is comfortable.

Accommodation on the Streatham Campus

Live and socialise with your fellow students from many different countries on campus!

Placement Test

We ask every student to take a placement test as soon as possible, at least 7 days prior to arrival. This test is **ESSENTIAL** for your placement in the right English class, thus giving you the best possible chance of success in your English language learning. The online test is designed to be convenient and flexible, allowing you to complete it at a time that suits you best. It ensures you're positioned in a class that matches your abilities from your first day on. Upon your arrival and commencement of lessons, our dedicated teachers will conduct **comprehensive observations** during your first day of classes. Specifically focusing on **speaking skills**, these observations will provide valuable insights into your real-time language abilities and interaction in a classroom setting. The **speaking component** score obtained from the classroom observations will be combined with the results of your **online placement test**. This comprehensive approach ensures a **holistic evaluation** of your language skills. Based on this combined assessment, you will be placed in an **even more suitable English language level** that aligns perfectly with your proficiency from your second day onward.

If you are unable to complete the test beforehand, don't worry – you'll join a **mixed-level testing group** on your first day, with the opportunity to take the test during your initial lesson and spend the day in this group for the teacher to conduct comprehensive observations focusing on speaking skills. Based on this combined assessment, you will be placed in a **suitable English language level** that aligns perfectly with your proficiency from your second day onward.

Please do it only once, on your own, in a quiet space. It should not take you more than 30 minutes to complete it. Before you start, make sure your headphones, earphones, speakers are working as you will have to listen to a few recordings in the last part of the test.

Language Courses

- ✓ On the first day of school, your first lesson starts at 9 am.
- ✓ Our courses encompass listening and reading comprehension, grammar, and conversation. Dynamic instruction from (usually) more than one teacher a day with varying methods ensures a well-rounded learning journey. Topics rooted in local culture and everyday life enrich your learning, complemented by intercultural insights gained from collaborating with students worldwide.
- ✓ If you feel that you are in a level that is too easy or too difficult, please talk to your teacher or supervisor.
- ✓ Your teachers are dedicated professionals and carefully chosen to provide a positive and stimulating learning environment. You will be provided with teaching materials such as a notebook, folder, paper, pen, and copies.
- ✓ At the conclusion of your journey, you'll receive a **certificate** that reflects your learning triumphs. This tangible testament to your dedication and progress stands as a reminder of your accomplishments.
- ✓ According to prior agreement with your teacher, you are allowed to bring your Laptop/Tablet to the lessons and use them for the internet-based exercises. International Projects is not liable for damage or loss of your electronic equipment.

General English Course (15 x 45 minutes / week)

- ✓ Classes are normally held Monday to Friday from 9:00 to 11:45.
- ✓ Each of the morning session is aimed at specific language aspects: grammar mastery, vocabulary, reading and listening comprehension, and interactive speaking practice. With a focus on enhancing your speaking and listening skills, we're dedicated to nurturing confident communication and breaking inhibitions.

Intensive English Course (20 x 45 minutes / week)

- ✓ This supplement integrates the General English Course (Monday to Friday, 09:00-11:45, including breaks) with an extra daily session (11:45 - 12:30), devoted to project-based learning, group dynamics, writing finesse, and public speaking prowess.

Mini-Group English Course (20x45 minutes / week)

- ✓ This is a highly individualised course. The lessons are based on the same concept as the intensive course for groups of up to 6 students. Generally, lessons will take place between 9.00 am and 12.30 pm (including breaks) from Monday to Friday.

Your Supervisors

Your IP Supervisors are young people who enjoy working and travelling with kids and teens and have undergone extensive training with IP. They put together the activity programme and are always available for questions and advice.

If there is something you are not satisfied with, please feel free to talk to your supervisor in order to resolve the reason for your discomfort.

During the daily assemblies (Monday – Friday) the upcoming programme will be explained and in the daily *Time to Talk* (TTT) you have the chance to talk about potential problems or questions in a smaller group with your designated IP Supervisor. In your TTT session you can also sign up for trips and activities. Generally, for students up to 15 years we have a tighter supervision scheme than for 16 years and older. Our activity programme is partly compulsory for under 16 year olds but you can choose between different activities in the afternoons.

We have our own App which students must use to sign up to activities or to 'sign out' if they are permitted to. You can find there all the activities offered and chose with your friends what you like to do.

Students under 13 years need to participate in a compulsory afternoon and evening activity programme with a daily variety of options to choose from. The afternoon programme for students aged between 13-15 years is partly compulsory. They will have two afternoons per week where one of the activities offered will be 'sign out'. There will be other activities offered on these days also so you can choose to remain with a supervisor if you prefer. On the other days students will be expected to participate in one of the activities offered. All evening activities are compulsory for 13–15-year-olds.

16- and 17-year-old students have the option to sign-out in the afternoons every day and can also sign out in the evenings for two evenings per week.

The school retains the right to remove the privilege to sign out for any reason even if the parents have given permission.

Activity Programme

The activity programme consists of sports, workshops, and games in the afternoon. In the evening movie and game nights, IP's got Talent shows, theme parties and much more will be organised for you. The majority of the activity programme as well as the lessons will take place on campus. Apart from that, you can relax in the IP Ocean Lounge with snacks, drinks, and music, while meeting up with new friends. You can find all the activities offered in our app and can chose with your friends what you like to do.

Your language holiday also includes one half day trip during your first week and one half day trip and one full day trip for each additional week.

You will be informed about the trip destinations on arrival.

In addition to that you can purchase extra trips in your destination. Please ask your supervisor for extra costs for additional trips.

Pocket Money

Experience has shown that our young guests spend an average of 60 to 100 Pounds per week.

Important: We recommend taking a cash card with you. Cash machines for normal cash cards are located all over England. Your bank will be able to inform you about the best option for your trip to England.

If you take cash with you, we recommend exchanging your currency for Pounds in your home country but make sure that they don't give you old bank notes (feel like paper). **Plastic banknotes are the only ones accepted.**

Please be sure to take enough pocket money with you.

A safe is not available for your use. However, the rooms are lockable. If necessary, you can hand your pocket money and valuable items to the IP Team for safekeeping.

In cases of theft, loss, or damage to money and/or valuable items, IP is not liable.

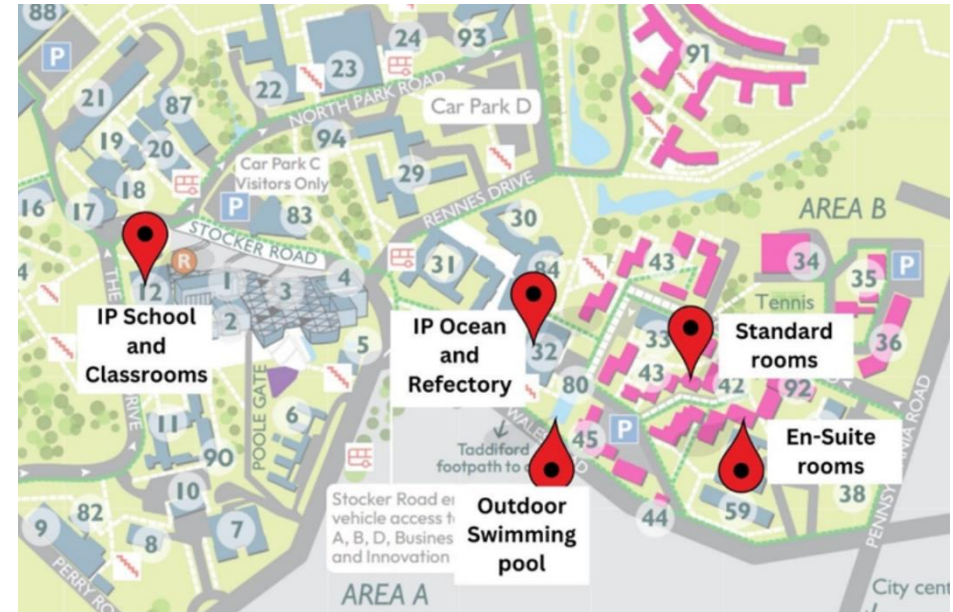

IP Rules & Regulations for Exeter

These are our rules and regulations to ensure that you behave responsibly and safely during your summer course in our centres. These rules must be adhered to and must be respected by all students.

- **Respect other students:** Our aim is to bring together international young people from all over the world in our course centres, who want to learn a foreign language and gain intercultural experiences. Therefore discriminating, racist or sexist behaviour will not be tolerated.
- **Mandatory Attendance:** The lessons, the daily assemblies/ TTT time to talk, as well as the meals must be attended by all IP students.
- **Leaving the Campus:** Students aged under 13 are not permitted to leave the campus unaccompanied at any time.
Students aged 13 – 16 years will be allowed to leave the campus unaccompanied - 'sign out' - if their parents/guardians have given permission, for two pre-appointed afternoons per week. They are not allowed to 'sign out' on other days or in the evenings.
Students aged 16+ are allowed to sign out every afternoon and for two pre appointed evenings per week if their parents/guardians have given permission.
There are some general guidelines we issue to all students on arrival about safety during sign out which we expect all students to adhere to eg ensuring your mobile phone is charged and your number is on the app. Where we feel students are not able or willing to follow these guidelines then the school retains the right to remove this sign out privilege for any reason even if the parents have given permission. There are always exciting alternative supervised activities on offer for those who don't wish to sign out or for those whose parents or guardians have withheld permission.
We also offer an activity called 'Free time in Town' where students are accompanied from the campus to the town centre and are allowed up to 2 hours of free time to explore the city centre in pairs or larger groups. This option is offered to all students aged over 13 years.

- **During excursions** you will also have the chance to explore and have some free time in pairs or groups with a staff member waiting for you at the meeting point. Please note, students under the age of 13 must be accompanied by a member of staff. Students 13 years and older may leave in groups of two or more.
- **Curfew/Night Check:** All students must be in their rooms at 10.30 pm. Staff members will conduct a night check at 11pm to ensure that all students are in their rooms.
- **Noise:** Please respect the need for quiet of fellow students and residents living nearby particularly after 10pm.
- **Privacy:** The privacy of fellow students and staff must be respected. Do not enter designated areas or rooms of fellow students without permission.
- **Rooms:** Rooms can only be shared by students of the same sex.
- **Damages/loss of keys:** IP will have to be reimbursed for all damages or loss of keys. In accidental cases, the damages are probably covered by your insurance.
- **Theft:** Please always take care of your belongings as we do not take responsibility for lost or stolen items. We report all thefts to the police. In case no safe and lockable room is available we offer a secure area in our office to store valuables.
- **Fire safety:** Fire doors cannot be blocked or left open. Setting off fire extinguishers will be dealt with as an act of vandalism. There is a 300 GBP penalty charge for setting off the fire alarm unnecessarily.
- **Alcohol:** It is forbidden to consume alcohol of any kind during your stay.
- **Smoking/Vaping:** Smoking/vaping is not allowed in the UK.
- **Drugs:** Consumption or dealing of drugs is strictly prohibited.
- **Weapons:** Carrying weapons of any kind (flick knives, tear gas, etc.) is forbidden.
- **Tattoos/Piercings:** Students under the age of 18 are not allowed to get tattoos or piercings during their stay.
- **Swimming:** Please note, that sea swimming is not an IP organised activity, and you are asked not to swim in the sea during your stay.

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However, it is principally allowed on supervised beaches/pools only when a lifeguard is present, unless otherwise determined in writing by parents/guardians.

- **Mobiles:** The use of mobile telephones during lessons and assemblies is not allowed. If disregarded, staff may confiscate the mobile phone. IP is not liable for the loss or damage of mobile phones.
- **Social Media:** Students are not allowed to post pictures and/or videos of other participants which may harm their reputation and/or violate their privacy. Please post responsibly.
- **E-Safety:** Accessing, viewing or sharing inappropriate materials online or via social media is strictly forbidden.

Disrespecting our rules and regulations may have legal consequences and may result in a student being asked to leave the course. IP will not cover any additional costs that may arise from a student's suspension.
