Trip descriptions

Half Day Trips

📍 Pick up / return point: Freemason's Hall, Knole Road, BH14DH, Boscombe, Bournemouth

 Duration: 5 hours (*incl. 45-60 min driving to the destination and back*)

Destinations	Description
Jurassic Coast Durdle Door	On this trip, we'll explore one of England's most iconic natural landmarks. We'll start at Durdle Door Caravan Park, walk up to the cliffs for a stunning view, then down to Durdle Door, and finish in West Lulworth, where we'll meet at the parking lot for our departure. Toilets are available at the start (in the shop) and end of the tour. The Jurassic Coast, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, spans 155 km of dramatic coastline and reveals 180 million years of Earth's history. Along the way, you'll learn about fossils, geology, and local history. Durdle Door is a famous limestone arch formed by erosion and owned by the Lulworth Estate. It's one of Dorset's top attractions—ideal for photography, coastal walks, and beach visits. Please don't climb the arch for safety reasons. After a short walk along the coast path, enjoy some free time in West Lulworth.
Winchester (incl. Great Hall)	We'll arrive around 14:30, beginning our walking tour at the Alfred the Great Statue (65 The Broadway). From there, we'll explore some of England's finest historic sites. First, we'll visit the Winchester Cathedral, one of Europe's largest Gothic cathedrals, known for its stunning architecture and as the burial site of author Jane Austen. Next is the Great Hall of Winchester Castle, home to the legendary Round Table of King Arthur—a must-see for history lovers. The guided tour will take around 45 minutes, depending on our pace. Afterwards, students can enjoy free time to explore the shops, grab a snack, or revisit their favourite spot. Then we will return to the Alfred the Great Statue for our departure.
Salisbury (incl. Cathedral visit)	Upon arrival at the Mercure Salisbury White Hart Hotel, we'll begin our walking tour through this historic city. Our first stop is Malmesbury House, a beautiful 18th-century home with royal connections. Then we'll visit St Thomas's Church, known for its striking "Doom" painting and medieval charm. Next, we pass the Haunch of Venison, one of Salisbury's oldest pubs, full of ghost stories and local legends. Our final stop is the magnificent Salisbury Cathedral, home to Britain's tallest spire and one of the four surviving original copies of the Magna Carta—a true national treasure. After the tour, enjoy free time to explore the cathedral grounds, local shops, or grab a bite to eat. Please be back at Salisbury Cathedral by the meeting time. The coach departs from the Mercure Salisbury White Hart Hotel, so don't be late!
Portsmouth	We'll begin our visit at The Hard Interchange, where you'll have a quick toilet stop before starting a 30–45-minute walking tour through the heart of this historic naval city. Our first highlight is the Spinnaker Tower, a striking 170-metre landmark offering panoramic views over the coast and the Solent. Then we'll see HMS Warrior, Britain's first iron-hulled warship, and HMS Victory, Admiral Nelson's famous flagship from the Battle of Trafalgar. After the tour, you'll have free time to explore Gunwharf Quays, a popular outlet shopping centre filled with shops, cafés, and sea views. You might also enjoy a closer

	look at the historic dockyard or take in the harbour atmosphere. Please return to The Hard Interchange by the meeting time. We'll depart from there, so be sure to arrive a few minutes early!
Stonehenge	We'll depart from the IP Centre at 13:00 and arrive at Stonehenge around 14:00. The visit includes a 30-minute walk and ample time to explore the site and visitor centre. We'll depart at 17:00, returning to the IP Centre by 18:00. Stonehenge is one of Britain's most iconic and mysterious prehistoric monuments. Built around 3100 B.C., it has stood for over 3,500 years. Its exact purpose remains unknown, but it's thought to have served as a ceremonial or astronomical site. There are many myths surrounding Stonehenge—some believe it was built by giants; others say the wizard Merlin magically transported the stones from Ireland. Theories also suggest it's an ancient calendar, aligned with the summer and winter solstices. Be sure to visit the exhibition and reconstructed Neolithic houses before we meet back at the coach. <u>Don't miss your chance to walk around this legendary site!</u>
Swanage or Old Harry Rocks* <i>*Optionally, by public transport (groups up to 22 pax) + 45 min walking distance from the bus stop to Old Harry Rocks</i>	Old Harry Rocks are striking chalk formations near Handfast Point, about 2 miles northeast of Swanage. They mark the eastern end of the Jurassic Coast World Heritage Site and offer stunning views of the Dorset coastline. Access By Public Transport: Take an open-top bus from Bournemouth to Swanage, or Studland Village. From there, it's a short walk to the start of the walking trails. Walking Trails: 1) Swanage to Old Harry Rocks: A 6.5-mile out-and-back trail starting from King Alfred Memorial in Swanage. This moderate route offers panoramic coastal views. 2) Studland Beach to Old Harry Rocks: A 4.3 km out-and-back trail suitable for all ages, offering flat terrain and breathtaking cliffside views. These walks provide an excellent opportunity to experience the natural beauty and geological significance of the area.
Christchurch* <i>*by public transport, approx. 30 min</i>	Christchurch, founded around AD 650, is a charming town located between two rivers, offering beautiful views and a rich history. The town is home to the Priory Church, where a local legend tells of a miraculous beam placed by an unknown carpenter, believed to be Christ. This miracle gave Christchurch its name. The Castle Ruins, dating back to the 12th century, are a must-see, offering scenic views and a glimpse into the past. Enjoy exploring this picturesque town!

Destinations	Description
London	London is a vibrant city brimming with world-class museums, iconic landmarks, and rich history, offering something unforgettable for every traveller. We'll begin at the Tate Britain Museum on Millbank for a quick introduction and toilet stop. The walking tour will take around 2 hours, with a break for lunch. We'll explore iconic landmarks, including Westminster Palace, Big Ben, the London Eye (view from afar), and Westminster Abbey. Stroll through St James's Park to reach Buckingham Palace, then continue to Trafalgar Square. After the tour, you'll have free time to explore further and will then meet back at Trafalgar Square. The tour will conclude back at Tate Britain Museum on Millbank

Bath	<i>*Optionally, incl. Roman Baths and/or Royal Crescent visit</i> Bath is a UNESCO World Heritage site, famous for its stunning Georgian architecture, Roman baths, and rich history. We'll start at North Parade Road with a toilet stop before beginning our 45-minute walking tour. Our first stop is Sally Lunn's Historic Eating House & Museum, where you can learn about Bath's famous buns. Next, we'll visit Bath Abbey, known for its magnificent architecture, and the ancient Roman Baths. We'll also explore the Theatre Royal, one of the oldest working theatres in the UK, and stroll over the iconic Pulteney Bridge. Finally, we'll pass through the historic Guildhall and Market. After the tour, enjoy free time to explore Bath's shops and cafes. Please return to North Parade Road by the meeting time for departure. Bath is a perfect blend of history, culture, and beauty—don't miss the chance to explore this incredible city!
Brighton	Brighton, a lively seaside destination, offering mix of history, culture, and stunning coastal views. We'll begin our tour at Madeira Drive (Near the Pier) with a toilet stop, followed by a 1 to 1.5-hour walking tour. We'll visit the beautiful Steine Gardens and the stunning Royal Pavilion, a former royal palace. We'll also explore the Brighton Museum & Art Gallery and the historic Theatre Royal Brighton. Stroll through the iconic Lanes, known for its charming shops and alleys, before ending at Brighton Palace Pier. After the tour, enjoy some free time to explore more of Brighton. Please return to Madeira Drive (Near the Pier) by the meeting time for departure. Brighton offers something for everyone—whether you love history, shopping, or simply enjoying the beach!
Oxford	<i>*Optionally, incl. Christ Church College visit with Hall and Cathedrale</i> Oxford, known for its prestigious university and stunning architecture, is a city full of history and culture. We'll start at St Aldate, opposite the Police Station, with a toilet stop on Speedwell Street before beginning our 1 to 1.5-hour walking tour. Our journey will take us to Christ Church Cathedral, Church of St Mary the Virgin, and the iconic Radcliffe Camera. We'll explore the historic Bodleian Library, the famous Bridge of Sighs, and the magnificent Sheldonian Theatre. We'll end at Carfax Tower, offering panoramic views of the city. After the tour, enjoy some free time to explore Oxford further. Please return to Carfax Tower by the meeting time for departure. Oxford offers a unique blend of academic history and architectural beauty—perfect for history buffs, students, and tourists alike!
Warner Bros Studio	If you are a Harry Potter fan – this trip is an absolute must-see. Warner Bros. Studio Tour London provides an amazing new opportunity to explore the magic of the Harry Potter films – the most successful film series of all time. This unique walking tour takes you behind-the-scenes and showcases a huge array of beautiful sets, costumes and props. It also reveals some closely guarded secrets, including facts about the special effects and animatronics that made these films so hugely popular all over the world.
Windsor Castle	Windsor Castle is a royal residence at Windsor in the English county of Berkshire. It is notable for its long association with the English and later British royal family and for its architecture. The original castle was built in the 11th century after the Norman invasion of England by William the Conqueror. Since the time of Henry I, it has been used by the reigning monarch and is the longest-occupied palace in Europe. The castle's lavish early 19th-century State Apartments were described as "a superb and unrivalled sequence of rooms widely regarded as the finest and most complete expression of later Georgian taste".
Stratford-Upon-Avon	Immerse yourself in the British literature history! Birthplace of Shakespeare, you will be charmed by this medieval market town packed with more than 800 years of history and heritage. We will walk on Shakespeare footsteps, discover the house where his was born and spent his childhood, the Swan theatre, the Royal Shakespeare theatre, the Holy Trinity Church where he was baptised and buried, and of course, have a stroll along the stunning river Avon, in the riverside garden.
