Westgate Museum and The Great Hall

Discover the legendary Round Table of King Arthur at The Great Hall, the last remaining part of Winchester Castle. This impressive medieval hall offers a glimpse into royal history, chivalry, and justice. Learn about the powerful figures who once ruled from Winchester, explore the dramatic architecture, and enjoy the peaceful Queen Eleanor's Garden just outside. Climb up to one of Winchester's ancient city gates and enjoy panoramic views from the rooftop of Westgate Museum. This fortified medieval gateway once served as a debtors' prison and holds a fascinating collection of historic weapons, armor, and graffiti left by prisoners. A small but mighty museum packed with stories from the city's past.

Destinations	Description
Salisbury (incl. Cathedral visit)	Upon arrival at the Mercure Salisbury White Hart Hotel, we'll begin our walking tour through this historic city. Our first stop is Malmesbury House, a beautiful 18th-century home with royal connections. Then we'll visit St Thomas's Church, known for its striking "Doom" painting and medieval charm. Next, we pass the Haunch of Venison, one of Salisbury's oldest pubs, full of ghost stories and local legends. Our final stop is the magnificent Salisbury Cathedral, home to Britain's tallest spire and one of the four surviving original copies of the Magna Carta—a true national treasure. After the tour, enjoy free time to explore the cathedral grounds, local shops, or grab a bite to eat. Entrance fee included! Please be back at Salisbury Cathedral by the meeting time. The coach departs from the Mercure Salisbury White Hart Hotel, so don't be late!
Portsmouth incl. Historic Dockyard with one attraction	We'll begin with the visit of the Historic Dockyard which offers an unforgettable voyage through Britain's naval past. From the grandeur of Nelson's flagship to the grit of submarines and interactive adventures, it's a historic experience that educates, entertains, and inspires — ideal for families, students, and history lovers alike. We recommend the <i>Mary Rose Museum</i> as attraction (estimated visit time 1.5 hours). Afterward you are also able to walk around and see all the other boats from the outside. There are many cafes and gift shops as well. There is a building called 'Boathouse 4' which you can go into for free also which often has exhibitions in. Entrance fee included! Our walking tour lasts 30–45-minute and goes through the heart of this historic naval city. Our first highlight is the Spinnaker Tower, a striking 170-metre landmark offering panoramic views over the coast and the Solent. Then we'll see HMS Warrior, Britain's first iron-hulled warship, and HMS Victory, Admiral Nelson's famous flagship from the Battle of Trafalgar. After the tour, you'll have free time to explore Gunwharf Quays, a popular outlet shopping centre filled with shops, cafés, and sea views. Please return to The Hard Interchange by the meeting time. We'll depart from there, so be sure to arrive a few minutes early!
Stonehenge	The visit includes a 30-minute walk and ample time to explore the site and visitor centre. Stonehenge is one of Britain's most iconic and mysterious prehistoric monuments. Built around 3100 B.C., it has stood for over 3,500 years. Its exact purpose remains unknown, but it's thought to have served as a ceremonial or astronomical site. There are many myths surrounding Stonehenge—some believe it was built by giants; others say the wizard Merlin magically transported the stones from Ireland. Theories also suggest it's an ancient calendar, aligned with the summer and winter solstices. Be sure to visit the exhibition and reconstructed Neolithic houses before we meet back at the coach. Don't miss your chance to walk around this legendary site! Entrance fee included
Southampton	Southampton is the largest city in the county of Hampshire, on the south coast of England. It has the busiest cruise terminal in the UK and was one of the departure points for D-Day. Rich in history, and in constant modernisation, Southampton is shared between the industrial part, with a large shopping centre and retail park, and its historical heart. Students will discover the terminal, see the SS Shieldhall, Holyrood Church and Tudor House in the old town, and the medieval walls. After our guided tour where we will pass the Titanic Memorial, the harbour and the Bargate, Students can spend their free time shopping in the mall. The visit also includes visiting the Sea City Museum to discover more about Southampton and the Titanic's story. Built within the grand Grade II*-listed Civic Centre, SeaCity Museum invites visitors to explore Southampton's deep-rooted maritime heritage through three engaging galleries. Opened in April 2012 to mark the Titanic's centenary, it blends historic architecture with bold modern design by Wilkinson Eyre. The Titanic Story is told compellingly through the exhibits and artefacts on display. Entrance fees included.

Destinations	Description
London	London is a vibrant city brimming with world-class museums, iconic landmarks, and rich history, offering something unforgettable for every traveller. We'll begin at the Tate Britain Museum on Millbank for a quick introduction and toilet stop. The walking tour will take around 2 hours, with a break for lunch. We'll explore iconic landmarks, including Westminster Palace, Big Ben, the London Eye (view from afar), and Westminster Abbey. Stroll through St James's Park to reach Buckingham Palace, then continue to Trafalgar Square. After the tour, you'll have free time to explore further and will then meet back at Trafalgar Square. The tour will conclude back at Tate Britain Museum on Millbank. No entrance fees included
Bath	*Optionally, incl. Roman Baths visit. Entrance fees included! Bath is a UNESCO World Heritage site, famous for its stunning Georgian architecture, Roman baths, and rich history. We'll start at North Parade Road with a toilet stop before beginning our 45-minute walking tour. Our first stop is Sally Lunn's Historic Eating House & Museum, where you can learn about Bath's famous buns. Next, we'll visit Bath Abbey, known for its magnificent architecture, and the ancient Roman Baths. We'll also explore the Theatre Royal, one of the oldest working theatres in the UK, and stroll over the iconic Pulteney Bridge. Finally, we'll pass through the historic Guildhall and Market. After the tour, enjoy free time to explore Bath's shops and cafes. Please return to North Parade Road by the meeting time for departure. Bath is a perfect blend of history, culture, and beauty—don't miss the chance to explore this incredible city! No entrance fees included.
Brighton	Brighton, a lively seaside destination, offering mix of history, culture, and stunning coastal views. We'll begin our tour at Madeira Drive (Near the Pier) with a toilet stop, followed by a 1 to 1.5-hour walking tour. We'll visit the beautiful Steine Gardens and the stunning Royal Pavilion, a former royal palace. We'll also explore the Brighton Museum & Art Gallery and the historic Theatre Royal Brighton. Stroll through the iconic Lanes, known for its charming shops and alleys, before ending at Brighton Palace Pier. After the tour, enjoy some free time to explore more of Brighton. Please return to Madeira Drive (Near the Pier) by the meeting time for departure. Brighton offers something for everyone—whether you love history, shopping, or simply enjoying the beach! No entrance fees included.
Oxford	*Optionally, incl. Christ Church College visit with Hall and Cathedral, entrance fees included Oxford, known for its prestigious university and stunning architecture, is a city full of history and culture. We'll start at St Aldate, opposite the Police Station, with a toilet stop on Speedwell Street before beginning our 1 to 1.5-hour walking tour. Our journey will take us to Christ Church Cathedral, Church of St Mary the Virgin, and the iconic Radcliffe Camera. We'll explore the historic Bodleian Library, the famous Bridge of Sighs, and the magnificent Sheldonian Theatre. We'll end at Carfax Tower, offering panoramic views of the city. After the tour, enjoy some free time to explore Oxford further. Please return to Carfax Tower by the meeting time for departure. Oxford offers a unique blend of academic history and architectural beauty—perfect for history buffs, students, and tourists alike! No entrance fees included.
Windsor Castle	Windsor Castle is a royal residence at Windsor in the English county of Berkshire. It is notable for its long association with the English and later British royal family and for its architecture. The original castle was built in the 11th century after the Norman invasion of England by William the Conqueror. Since the time of Henry I, it has been used by the reigning monarch and is the longest-occupied palace in Europe. The castle's lavish early 19th-century State Apartments were described as "a superb and unrivalled sequence of rooms widely regarded as the finest and most complete expression of later Georgian taste". Entrance fees included.
